Jo Barnes "My quilting journey started when my twins were about 3 years old. I was a member of Mother of Twins club in Schenectady, NY. Another member, Sue, had joined

the Schenectady Quilt Guild and asked a third friend, Lola, and I if we would be interested in coming to a guild meeting. We agreed.

It so happened that, at that meeting, there was a speaker, Mary Ellen Hopkins, from California. She started her talk with the fact that she sewed while watching Johnny Carson. Each night, she decided to use a traditional pattern (1 top), then put it on point (2nd top), then sash it (3rd top), etc. She must have had 30 quilts with her. I was in awe. She also had published books using her techniques. Needless to say, in the next several years, I purchased them all.

After that meeting, Lola and I decided to try our hands at this. We went to a quilt shop to choose fabrics. Lola had 3 sons so she chose blue for her background. I have boy-girl twins and another boy so, wanting to be

different, I chose lime green. We each made 3 spider web quilts. I was hooked. These quilts were well used over the next several years, until only threads remained.

I continued to go to the guild meetings and met other quilters. About 6 of us started a friendship group, Stitch N Bitch, meeting on Fridays. In fact, we did do a few projects but used our meeting to decompress from working all week as an OBGYN nurse teaching classes all over the world and affiliating with several different hospitals and clinics over my career.

Over the years, I have taken many classes, both in the Albany, NY area and in and around Annapolis (I moved down here in 2001). I have long ago moved away from calicos (the only fabric patterns available when I started my journey) and now focus on batiks and fabrics that have movement without defined patterns; all in bright colors. I also love to use techniques such as foundation piecing, and, most recently, improv quilts. My journey continues."

# Quilt Challenge 2025 - Color Theory in Quilted Art

Let's challenge ourselves by using some art theory basics in our quilting! We know many of you probably already use the color wheel as a tool in selecting colors for your artwork (yes, your quilts are artwork!), but let's make it even more fun with a bit of randomness!

For this challenge, there are two factors we are using. First is the color wheel, which is broken into 12 colors. Second, we will be using a chart of typical color schemes from the basics of art theory, which includes 9 options.

To participate, come see us at the Events table to roll some fancy dice to discover your fated colors and color scheme. We're happy to let you decide on either the starting color or the color scheme, or you can roll the dice for both choices for a fully random challenge!

#### Here's the fine print:

- 1. Only quilts created in response to this challenge will be eligible for submission. The intention is to encourage participants to explore novel and unexpected ideas as a result of this specific challenge.
- 2. The quilt's perimeter should measure a MINIMUM of 50"
- 3. Please bring your quilt to the May 2025 meeting, so we may display it and present members can "ooh" and "aah", as well as vote for their favorites! We'll award some ribbons to the winners.
- 4. Please attach the color wheel "cheat sheet" you were given at sign up to your quilt, so that we can see how awesomely you have completed your unique challenge! We also welcome any written provenance (your quilt's origin story) you would like to include; please pin or clip it onto your quilt.
- 5. The quilt should have a hanging sleeve if you would like to include it in the annual display at MAQF. If you just want to show it at the May meeting, no sleeve is required.

# Children's Holiday Quilt Donations

During the upcoming festive season, we will contribute to the Holiday Sharing Program via the Anne Arundel County Department of Social Services Community Initiatives and Programs. They serve over 2,000 families and the elderly during the holidays by providing a Thanksgiving and/or Christmas dinner along with Holiday gifts for children 15 years old and younger.

- Our donated quilts would be for children 15 years old and younger.
- Good sizes are approximately 40" x 50" for younger kids and 50" x 60" for older children. Up to twin size quilts are acceptable.
- Quilts are preferred but other comfortable coverings, such as fleece blankets, are also welcome.
- The quilts will be collected at the December meeting. Our goal is to have at least 120 quilts. Please wash the quilt prior to donation, we recommend using color catchers also.

Big thank you to Deb Clovis for working hard over the summer to prepare tons of pre-cut quilt kits! Big thank you to those members who have made generous donations of fabric to be used in this endeavor! Stop by and grab a kit to start your donation guilt. These kits alone won't be enough to meet our goal, so this is also a great way to use up some of that stash you haven't cut into yet! You'll just need to add binding, batting, backing, and quilt it. Another option would be to use flannel as a backing and skip the batting! If you need assistance with the quilting, please contact us; we may have volunteers who can help with that part. Anyone willing to do some quilting for donation quilts, please let Amy or Tammy know; we would greatly appreciate it. We do have a limited number of pre-cut kits with backing included.
